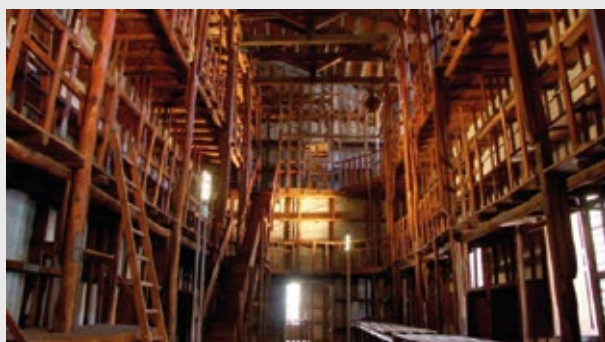
Welcome to **Palermo!**

VENUE:

Palazzo Branciforte - Sala dei 99

Largo Gae Aulenti, 2, 90133 Palermo

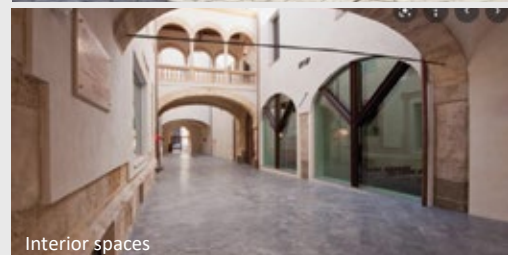
Built in the late 1500s, Palazzo Branciforte has a history closely linked to the life of Palermo. In 1801 it became the seat of the "Monte della Pietà for Foreclosure" and was intended to house the section of non-precious assets. Named "Monte di Santa Rosalia" in honor of the patron saint of the city, the building was seriously damaged in 1848, due to a fire, and later, during the Second World War, by air raids. In spite of everything, it was recovered and continued to host the pledge credit business until the eighties of the last century. It was then acquired by the Banco di Sicilia and in 2005 it became the property of the Banco di Sicilia Foundation which, thanks to a magnificent and original restoration project signed by the famous Gae Aulenti, made it a multipurpose cultural center.



The Monte di Santa Rosalia, a spectacular, timber-framed exhibition space that houses an important collection of traditional Sicilian pupi (puppets). The ground-floor archaeological collection claims over 4750 objects, many unearthed at the ruins of Selinunte. The palazzo also houses a small, interesting collection of majolica spanning from the 15th to 20th centuries.



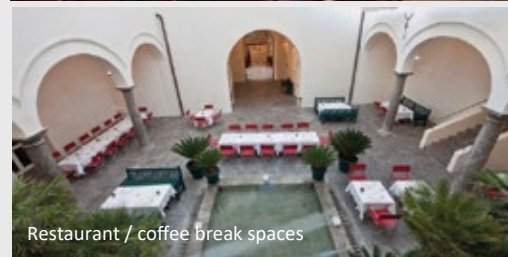

TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM PALERMO AIRPORT:

Bus service: Prestia e Comandè (journey time is 45/50 minutes).

Every half hour there is a bus from the airport and from the city (the last bus from the airport leaves at 00:30 hours, the first bus from the city departs already at 04:00 hours); the last stop is the main railway station Palermo Centrale, but you may get off at the penultimate bus stop (via Roma n.265), which is less than 400 meters away from the venue.

"Shared taxi":

Two platforms are located at the arrivals area for the taxi sharing cars
it costs 8 euros per person.

Taxi: Located at the Arrivals exit, there is an airport Taxi service which has been coordinated with the flight arrival timetable. The cost is usually 45/50 € for the distance airport-city center, something more for night-time (ask for the price before getting on board).

Train: from the airport arrive at the Central Station (cost 5,90 € - travel time about 75 minutes).

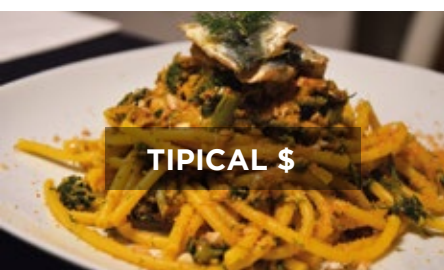
Francu u vastiddaru: via Vittorio Emanuele, 102 (at the corner with Piazza Marina)

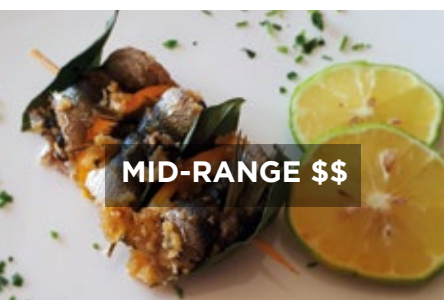

Foro Umberto I, seafront promenade, called «Foro Italico»



the historic **Via Maqueda**, pedestrian street, which will take you to the **Teatro Massimo** and the shopping street



San Cataldo Church, with the famous Arab domes

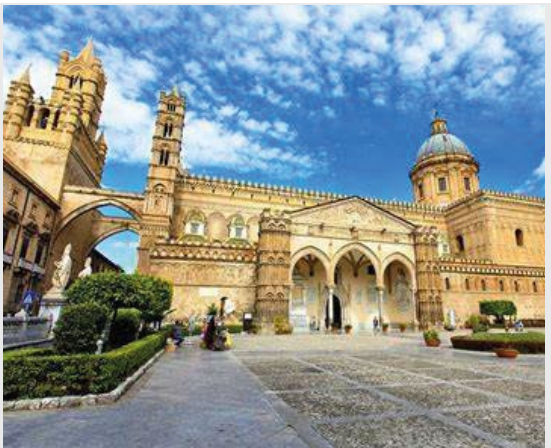

HOW TO GET AROUND WITH PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN YOUR FREE TIME:

Everything you may like to visit in Palermo can be reached walking, but if you want to move from the center, in the area you find several bus-stops:

In Via Roma every 5 minutes leave buses to the Central Station, from which you can take a **train to Cefalù**. It takes 45 minutes and the cost is around 11 € roundtrip. You can check the train timetable or buy the tickets on <http://www.trenitalia.com/tcom-en>

In Via Roma - opposite direction - **at the bus stop** “Via Roma-Vucciria” - you can find the numerous buses to “Sturzo-Politeama” (n. 101, n. 102, n. 103, n. 124), where you will find the connection (n. 806) to reach the **beautiful beach of Mondello**. Bus timetable on <http://amat.pa.it/moovit/>

In Via Roma - same direction - just after Piazza San Domenico, outside the “Rinascente” building, you can find the **“Prestia&Comandè” pullman stop to the airport**.

To go to **Barcarello** (beautiful see in Sferracavallo) you can take n.101 to “Giardino Inglese” where you will find the connection (n. 616) to reach the “Avamposto”, a **natural reserve on the side of Capo Gallo**: you have to walk 20 minutes, but it's very nice! You can check the bus timetable on <http://amat.pa.it/moovit/>

On the same web site, you can also check the bus to **Monreale**. You can go to the main Train Station and get the AST (Extra-urban ticket) to Monreale, or take the free-charge bus-line (“linea arancione”) in Corso Vittorio Emanuele and take the AST to Monreale in Piazza Indipendenza.

In Corso Vittorio Emanuele (between the “4 Canti” cross and the corner with Via Roma), you can find the bus stop for the free-charge bus-line, also called **“linea arancione” that runs around the entire city center**.
